ORDINANCE 2021-1
AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE VOTING PRECINCTS OF FLOYD COUNTY

BE IT ENACTED by the Board of Supervisors of Floyd County, Iowa:

SECTION I – Purpose – Repealing the adoption of Floyd County Ordinance 2011-1 Amended Establishing the Voting Precincts of Floyd County, Iowa as required following the 2020 Census.

SECTION II – Definitions – For use in this ordinance certain terms or words herein shall be interpreted or defined as follows:

1. “Board” means the Floyd County, Iowa Board of Supervisors.
2. “Ordinance” means a county law of a general and permanent nature.

SECTION III – Authority – The Board cites Chapter 49 of the Code of Iowa as their authority to compile and adopt an ordinance establishing the voting precincts of the County.

SECTION IV – Precincts – The Board has reviewed the results of the 2020 Census and has determined the voting precincts of Floyd County, Iowa shall be as follows:

- Rock Grove Precinct – all of the unincorporated portion of Rock Grove Township and the incorporated City of Nora Sprints in Rock Grove Township.
- Rockford Precinct – all of the unincorporated portion of Rockford Township and the incorporated City of Rockford in Rockford Township.
- Rudd/Floyd/Cedar/Niles Precinct – all of the unincorporated portion of Rudd Township and the incorporated City of Rudd in Rudd Township, all of the unincorporated portion of Floyd Township and the incorporated City of Floyd in Floyd Township, all of Cedar Township, and all of the unincorporated portion of Niles Township and the incorporated City of Colwell in Niles Township.
- Ulster/St Charles/Riverton Precinct – all of Ulster Township, all of the unincorporated portion of St Charles Township, and all of the unincorporated portion of Riverton Township and the incorporated portion of the City of Nashua lying within Riverton Township.
- Scott/Union/Pleasant Grove Precinct – all of Scott Township, all of the unincorporated portion of Union Township and the incorporated City of Marble Rock and the portion of the incorporated City of Greene lying within Union Township, and all of Pleasant Grove Township.
- City of Charles City precincts are the same as those directed by the City of Charles City, Ordinance #1155, Chapter 3, Election Precincts.

SECTION V – Combining precincts – This ordinance shall not be construed so as to restrict the Commissioner of Elections from combining voting precincts when prudent or necessary as allowed or required by the Code of Iowa.

SECTION VI – Repealer – All ordinance or parts of this ordinance in conflict with the provisions contained herein are hereby repealed.

SECTION VII – Severability – If any section, provision, or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged unconstitutional or otherwise invalid, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision, or part thereof not invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION VIII – When Effective – This ordinance shall be in full force and effect for all elections held after January 15, 2022.

Rudd/Floyd/Cedar/Niles Precinct – all of the unincorporated portion of Rudd Township and the incorporated City of Rudd in Rudd Township, all of the unincorporated portion of Floyd Township and the incorporated City of Floyd in

Floyd Township, all of Cedar Township, and all of the unincorporated portion of Niles Township and the incorporated City of Colwell in Niles Township.

Ulster/St Charles/Riverton Precinct – all of Ulster Township, all of the unincorporated portion of St Charles Township, and all of the unincorporated portion of Riverton Township and the incorporated portion of the City of Nashua lying within Riverton Township.

Scott/Union/Pleasant Grove Precinct – all of Scott Township, all of the unincorporated portion of Union Township and the incorporated City of Marble Rock and the portion of the incorporated City of Greene lying within Union Township, and all of Pleasant Grove Township.

City of Charles City precincts are the same as those directed by the City of Charles City, Ordinance #1155, Chapter 3, Election Precincts.

SECTION V – Combining precincts – This ordinance shall not be construed so as to restrict the Commissioner of Elections from combining voting precincts when prudent or necessary as allowed or required by the Code of Iowa.

SECTION VI – Repealer – All ordinance or parts of this ordinance in conflict with the provisions contained herein are hereby repealed.

SECTION VII – Severability – If any section, provision, or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged unconstitutional or otherwise invalid, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision, or part thereof not invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION VIII – When Effective – This ordinance shall be in full force and effect for all elections held after January 15, 2022.

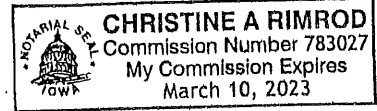
